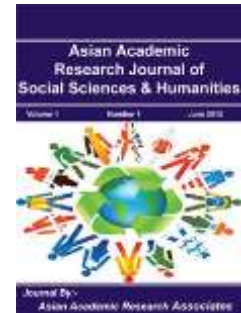




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OCCUPATIONAL STRESS AMONG HIGH SCHOOL LANGUAGE AND NON LANGUAGE TEACHERS

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ABSTRACT

The study was planned to investigate the “Occupational Stress among the High School Language and Non language Teachers”. A Random sample of 660 Language and Non language Teachers, in different Government High Schools located in Rural and Urban Areas in Chittoor District of Andhra Pradesh were collected. The occupational stress inventory (OSI) was developed and standardized by Samuel H.Osipow and Arnold R.Spokane (1987) was used for the present study. The study reveals that the High School Language Teachers experiencing more stress than the Non language Teachers. The study also found that the High School male Teachers experiencing more stress than the female Teachers. It is also observed that findings that the teachers with 0-10 years of tenure found to be experiencing more occupational stress than the teachers with 11-20 years of tenure. Further the findings of the study show that the Rural and Urban High School Teachers experiencing similar level of stress.
