Abstract

Street-Begging is one of the serious environmental and socio-economic urban problems, which appear to have defied solutions, particularly in the developing countries of the world. In this paper it is viewed that different facets of the problem need to be considered before it can be adequately addressed. It is against that backdrop that the paper attempts to unveil the cultural, socio-political and socio-economic correlates of begging in cities, particularly of developing countries.
